Session Focus

➤ The Essentials of Positive Supports

- Effective teaching and high levels of student success/engagement
- Multi-tiered prevention for behavior
 - Universal Interventions
 - Targeted Group Interventions (tier 2)
 - Intensive, Individual Interventions (tier 3)
- Connecting classroom to school-wide systems
- Direct teaching of social skills
- Establish System-Wide Behavior Pathways

➤ Behavioral Prevention

- Establish positive, predictable, consistent and rewarding school culture
- Teach social skills
- Address nonresponsive behavior positively and differently rather than reactively
- Actively supervise and pre-correct for problem behaviors and settings, especially classrooms
- Individualized based on responsiveness

➤ Establish Placement Pathway for Behavior/Social Emotional

- Decision Making Protocols
- Identify Specific Interventions for tiers 2 and 3
- Identify how students are identified as candidates for an IEP

➤ Evidence Based Intervention Practices

- Interventions that work, manageable for teachers
- Tier 2 Interventions
- Tier 3 Interventions

➤ Classroom Management Strategies that Work

- Establish high structure and maximize predictability
- Establish and reinforce positively stated expectations
- Reinforce appropriate behavior, deemphasize pointing out inappropriate behavior
- Maximize engagement
- Continuously monitor, pre correct and positively acknowledge
- Formalize how to deal with inappropriate behavior
- Multiple strategies for acknowledging appropriate behavior
